PORTLAND, MAINE - *A Tuna Christmas* at **Portland Stage**, by Jaston Williams, Joe Sears, and Ed Howard, runs **November 30** - **December 24, 2022**. The show opens at Portland Stage on Friday, December 2 at 7:30 pm. This play returns us to Tuna, the third smallest town in Texas, as Thurston Wheelis and Arles Struvie keep you up to the minute with all the local news, including updates on a contentious annual lawn display competition and town efforts to try to unmask the Christmas Phantom.

Portland Stage veteran **Tom Ford** is joined by **Nathaniel P. Claridad** (making his Portland Stage debut) and **each actor plays 11 different roles** in this quirky, quick-change satire of small-town life. Ford was most recently seen onstage as Moriarty in Portland Stage's production of *Sherlock Holmes: The Final Adventure*.

The Tuna plays, a series of four comedies that began with *Greater Tuna*, have always been a love letter to Texas written with a poisoned pen. Jaston Williams, Joe Sears, and Ed Howard wrote these plays in response to and reaction against the rise of the Moral Majority, a political organization associated with the Christian Right and the Republican Party founded in 1979 by Jerry Falwell, Sr. The Tuna plays are fierce and funny satires of life in Texas and all around this country, featuring flawed, sometimes truly horrible, funny human beings doing the best that they can–and not succeeding.

Ford and Claridad are directed by **Julia Gibson**, who directed our 2013 production of *Greater Tuna* and last season's *Searching for Mr. Moon*. The play features scenic designs by **Randall Parsons** (USA), costumes by **Cole McCarty** (USA), lights by **SeifAllah Salotto-Cristobal**, and sound by **Seth Asa Sengel**.

Portland Stage's production previews on November 30 and December 1 and will run from December 2 through November 24.

A Tuna Christmas is the third of six Mainstage productions in the 2022-23 Portland Stage season, which also includes the premiere of Sweet Goats and Blueberry Señoritas by Richard Blanco and Vanessa Garcia; August Wilson's How I Learned What I Learned; and The Cake by Bekah Brunstetter.
